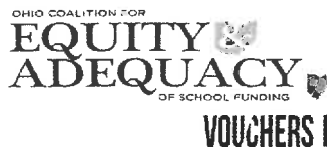

We are writing to the Superintendent and Treasurer of each Ohio K-12 school district, JVSD, and ESC that paid dues to the Coalition in support of the EdChoice school voucher litigation during any or all years since this venture started in fiscal year 2021.

First, we thank you for your past support and ask you to continue membership for fiscal year 2027. Help us (the dues paying districts) to continue this successful landmark endeavor.

The resounding trial court decision on June 24, 2025, and the crux of oral arguments before the 10th District Court of Appeals on May 12, 2026, gives us encouragement that the 10th District will uphold the trial court decision.

We, of course, must be assured of a funding stream that will be needed to argue the case before the Ohio Supreme Court. The 10th District Court of Appeals is certainly not the last stop for this case in the judicial process.

It will be of interest to you that the boards of education that have paid dues in support of the EdChoice voucher litigation educate the majority of the students enrolled in public school districts. Non-member districts are joining this effort on a frequent basis.
