Title I Memorandum of Understanding for the 2026-2027 School Year

Title I allocations are made to public school districts based on the number of low-income children residing in a particular district. Since district residents may be attending nonpublic schools located within another public school district's boundaries, funds allocated on a per pupil basis can be transferred from one district to another.

In accordance with federal rules and regulations, the purpose of the Tiffin City Schools (TCS) non-public program is:

1. To supplement the educational program for eligible students in non-public schools by providing services in consultation with the non-public school administrators.
2. To provide student progress reports and an annual evaluation to ensure that high quality services are being delivered; and
3. To provide funding to support opportunities for parent involvement to facilitate meaningful two-way communication between the parents and students served through the Title I program.

In compliance with the purpose of the Title I Non-Public School program, the Tiffin City Schools and Fremont City School District agree that:

The Fremont City School District will provide properly licensed educators to implement the Title I program serving eligible Tiffin City School students attending **Bishop Hoffman, St. Joseph Central Catholic**, a non-public school within the Fremont City School District boundary. The amount of funding will be calculated from the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce CCIP per pupil amount based on economic eligibility as reported by the nonpublic school to the LEA. The number of eligible pupils times the per pupil allocation for each participating non-public school will be used to calculate the total amount due to the Fremont City School District from Tiffin City Schools.

Educators will use a standardized assessment among multi-criterion to rank students based on academic performance and use this list to prioritize services for those most in need. Educators will provide instruction based on the state academic content standards. Educators will administer standardized post-tests to evaluate students' growth and the effectiveness of the Title I nonpublic program. Copies of student progress reports and the overall program evaluation will be shared in a timely manner with the LEA, State and Federal Program Office.

The Tiffin City School District will make payment to the Fremont City School District provided that they have complied with the above listed requirements and provided Tiffin City Schools with the proper documentation.

- For the 2026-2027 school year, Tiffin City Schools agrees to pay funds from its Title I nonpublic allocation in the amount of \$393.63 to Fremont City Schools. Of this \$393.63 amount, \$3.94 must be allocated for parent involvement.
- The Fremont City School District will provide school-parent compacts for the Title I students, evidence of parent involvement activities, training, materials, progress reports for Title I students, eligibility criteria

and a list of students residing in its district who attend Bishop Hoffman, St. Joseph Central Catholic to Fremont City Schools.

- Fremont City School District agrees to provide services equal to the service amount allocated by Tiffin City Schools.
- Eligible students from Tiffin City Schools will be identified for service by the selection procedures designed by Fremont City Schools.
- The Tiffin City Schools and the Fremont City School District agree after consultation to pool Title I funds across all participating public schools who agree to pool funds. Based on uniform criteria of educational need, the lowest-achieving Title I eligible private school children who attend Bishop Hoffman, St. Joseph Central Catholic regardless of their district of residence and without regard to how much funds children from low-income families within their private school generate towards the pool will be served. Eligible low-achieving children may receive Title I services even if their school has few or no children from low-income families who generate Title I funds.
- The Fremont City School District agrees to include the student(s) being served from Tiffin City Schools in all required district, state and/or federal Title I reports for the 2026-2027 school year.
- The Tiffin City School District will provide for effective control over, and accountability for, all funds property and assets. The Tiffin City School District will maintain title to materials, equipment and property purchased with those funds. The Tiffin City School District will allow the non-public schools to keep the items from year to year, in accordance with approved on-going activities, as long as records are maintained.
